










DIRECT CHARACTER TRAITS

MATERIALS NEEDED

- String
- Glue
- Scissors
- Optional items (to attach string paper to cardboard)
 - Stapler
 - Duct tape









LET'S MAKE A GERALD AND PIGGIE COSTUME!

- Cut out the Gerald and Piggie faces found on the next two pages
- 2. Place the faces down on cardboard to trace. Then cut out the outline in the shape of the Piggie and Gerald faces
 - If you are using paper plates, skip this step!
- 3. Glue or staple mask to the paper plate or cardboard
- 4. Cut out two long strings or strips of thick paper to be your headband. Punch holes to tie the string through or staple together












What would Gerald say?
